

Learning outcomes for Italian kids' classes – April, 2017 term

Group – From 3 to 7 years old:

1. Introducing yourself: Review of greetings and class expressions (in piedi, seduti, colorare, etc.)
2. Spare time: Likes and Dislikes
3. Clothes and colours
4. City and shops
5. My house: Parts of the house
6. Numbers and asking age
7. Days of the week and time expressions (yesterday, today, tomorrow)
8. Months of the year: Talk about your birthday

Group – From 8 to 12 years old:

1. Review of talking about yourself: Read a paragraph about a character talking about himself/herself, answer the questions and create your own character.
2. The definite articles in Italian to be combined with professions: Learning different professions and ask about someone's job.
3. Let's make new friends!: Review of the numbers and telling your age (ask someone's age, address, phone number, etc.)
4. Let me introduce you to my family – Part 1: Talking about the family (name, where they live, age and profession) linked to possessive adjectives (mio, mia, tuo, tua), and start using plurals in Italian.
5. Let me introduce you to my family – Part 2 : Listen to someone talking about his/her family, read a paragraph and ask about your classmate's family.
6. What time is it?: Express and ask the time in Italian.
7. When does the store open?: Ask what time the shops, cinemas and parks are open and close. Use of definite articles combined with parts of the city.
8. My day: Parts of the day. Use of the present simple in Italian to describe a typical day (Eg: I wake up, I eat, I play)

- **Please note that for the classes from 8 to 12 the new topics will be combined with topics learned in the past and previous lessons.**
- **The topics may change slightly depending on the class progress and needs.**
- **Each topic will be practiced through the use of games, songs and/or short videos.**
